About

The West Virginia Amateur Championship is an annual golf tournament held at The Greenbrier Resort in White Sulphur Springs, W.V. The Old White and The Meadows Course are both played during the 4 day championship.

The Championship brings together male amateur golfers from across West Virginia to compete and determine the best amateur golfer in the state.

Over 300 golfers attempt to qualify annually at one of the multiple qualifying sites across the state. This year 30 golfers were exempt leaving 90 qualifying spots to complete a field of 120 golfers.

The crowned state Amateur Champion receives an exemption into the United States Amateur.



Players' Dinner

The West Virginia Amateur Championship Players' Dinner is a pre-championship tradition where all qualifying players, past champions and guests are invited to attend.

The Players' Dinner is hosted by the West Virginia Golf Association each year. The purpose of the Players' Dinner is to celebrate the playing of the WV Amateur, honor the players and allow past champions to reminisce.

United Bank has been the generous sponsor of the Players' Dinner since 2021.

106th WV Amateur Championship Continued...



The first round of the 106th WV Amateur Championship kicked off June 1, 2025 with 120 amateur golfers teeing up on The Meadows Course. Brian Anania, 2014 Champion, scored 4 birdies and an eagle, placing him at the top of the leaderboard with a six under par 64, leading the competition by two strokes.

The second day of competition finished with 2022 Champion, Noah Mullens, with a one-stroke lead finishing the round two under par.

Round two on The Old White Course tested the golfer's skills. Following Monday's round, the field of 120 was cut to 51 golfers for the final two days of play.

After the cut from 120 golfers to 51, leader Mullens (2022), defending champion Christian Brand (2011 and 2024) and past champions Cameron Jarvis (2023), Philip Reale (2021), Brian Anania (2014) and Pat Carter (1995-2004, 2006, 2012) are still in contention.

WVGA Executive Director Chris Slack said, "We are excited to have the ongoing support of Astorg Auto and United Bank. In addition, it's great to have six former champions, representing 10 years of winner, in the field this week. The next two days of competition will be something to watch."

Day 3...

The third day of competition saw a tie for the lead on the Meadows Course between Owen Elliott and Cam Roam both at seven under par (-7) 203.

Owen Elliott and Cam Roam entered the final round on The Old White tied at 7-under par. On the first hole, Roam made birdie while Elliott bogeyed, giving Roam a two-stroke lead.

Owen evened up with Roam with a birdie on hole 13 and captured the lead with a birdie on the next hole.

After making par, Elliott advanced to a five-stroke lead on hole 16 and continued on to claim the title as the 106th WV Amateur Champion with a final score of 70.

Roam (1-under) was the only other player under par in the tournament. 2024 WV Amateur Champion Christian Brand, Ryan Bilby and Nick Dent finished tied for third place at even par.



The state's best professional and amateur golfers gathered at Sleepy Hollow Golf Club in Hurricane, WV July 23rd -25th for the 92nd West Virginia Open Championship. Opportunities for pros and amateurs to compete against each other are uncommon but, the WV Open brings the two together annually in quest of the top prize in the state. Generations Physical Therapy and Generations Ford made it all possible with their amazing partnership as Presenting Sponsors.

Sleepy Hollow hosted the WV Open for the first time since 2016. David Bradshaw, a 2025 Hall of Fame inductee, has won the last two WV Opens staged at Sleepy Hollow. Bradshaw is a 12-time Champion of the WV Open. His 12 championships rank second all-time, trailing closely behind legendary Sam Snead, who holds 17 titles.

Snead holds the record for the most victories in the tournament. His first victory was in 1936 at the Guyan Country Club in Huntington, WV and his final win was in 1974.



Snead's connection to the tournament is a significant part of his golfing legacy, alongside his 82 PGA Tour wins and 7 major championships.

From 2005-2022, professionals won 18 consecutive editions of the WV Open. That streak ended in 2023 when Ryan Bilby won the tournament at Berry Hills. Last year, golfer Todd Duncan won at Edgewood Country Club. Both Todd and Bilby played professionally in this year's WV Open.

Competition in the 54-hole event started with a field of 132 players and was cut to the best 60 scores after the second round.

Three-time Champion, Christian Brand, struggled to find momentum on his home course during the first seven holes of the final round. Brand grinded his way through after playing the first nine holes at even par and took the lead after making a birdie on the 13th hole. He was able to maintain a two-shot lead over the final three holes.

Christian Brand won his fourth WV Open by finishing the 54-hole event at 11-under par, two strokes ahead of former champions Ryan Bilby and Kenney Hess. He previously played professionally on the Web.com Tour making this his first WV Open title since fully returning to amateur status. Brand also won the WV Open in 2014, 2015 and 2022.

While Friday marked Brand's fourth open win the victory was a special one. "It's always been near and dear to my heart," Brand said. "Now, to win it as an amateur, a professional – and honestly an in-between when I won at Stonewall – it's very special to me."

Bilby and Hess each finished tied for second at 9-under. Sam O'Dell climbed the leaderboard over the final round to finish fourth at 8-under. Chris Williams and Nick Dent each finished tied for fifth at 7-under.

Twelve-time champion David Bradshaw finished tied for seventh place with Thadd Obecnycy II, Will Evans and Zach Chapman.

U.S Open Qualifier



About:

Professional and amateur golfers (who meet handicap requirements) can enter 18-hole local qualifying events held at numerous locations.

Those who perform well in local qualifiers advance to a 36-hole final qualifier.

The top finishers at each final qualifier earn a spot in the US Open field.

Many players receive automatic entry into the US Open through exemptions based on past performance or ranking, which fills the majority of the field before the qualifiers begin.



Todd Duncan of Daniels was one of four qualifiers and two alternates in the 18-hole U.S. Open local qualifying event on Tuesday, May 6th at The Pines Country Club in Morgantown, WV. Duncan finished at four under par (-4) 67.

Other qualifiers were professional golfer Logan Perkins of Atlanta, GA, tying with Kaleb Wilson of Knoxville, TN, at five under par (-5) 66 and Westy McCabe of Dallas, TX, finishing at three under par (-3) 68.

Logan Perkins is a West Virginia University Golf Team Alumni. Perkins graduated 2 years ago. The other three qualifiers, Wilson, McCabe, and Duncan are all currently on the WVU Golf Team.

The two alternates were Nathan Piatt of Pittsburgh, PA, and Max Green of Okatie, SC. They finished at two under par (-2) 69 and one under par (-1) 70.

The West Virginia Golf Association, in support and collaboration with the United States Golf Association, conducted the U.S. Open local qualifier.

The U.S. Open took place June 12th - 15th at Oakmont Country Club in Oakmont, PA.

70th U.S. Senior Amateur Qualifier

The West Virginia Golf Association in support and collaboration with the United States Golf Association, conducted the 70th U.S. Senior Amateur Qualifier July 16th at Stonewall Resort in Roanoke, WV. The WVGGA host one of 50 qualifiers across the country.

The U.S. Senior Amateur Qualifier is a qualifying tournament for the US Senior Amateur Championship, a national golf event run by the USGA for amateur golfers aged 55 and older with a USGA Handicap Index of 5.4 or lower.

These local qualifiers are single-round, 18-hole stroke play events held at various locations across the United States to select the players who will compete in the championship.

Trent Gregory of NC was the sole qualifier in the 70th U.S. Senior Amateur Qualifier scoring (-3) 69.

Arnold Cutrell and Robert Stoops, both of PA, were the two alternates. Cutrell finished at (E) 72, while Stoops finished at (+2) 74.

The field of 15 players called nine states home including West Virginia, Indiana, Maryland, North Carolina, Ohio, Pennsylvania, South Carolina, Texas and Virginia. This event gave the golfers a chance to experience the beauty and hospitality of West Virginia.

The U.S. Senior Amateur Championship was Aug. 23rd - 25th at Oak Hills Country Club in San Antonio, TX.

44th U.S. Mid – Amateur Qualifier

The U.S. Mid-Amateur, often called the Mid-Am, is the leading annual golf tournament organized by the USGA in the United States for post-college amateur golfers at least 25 years old and have a USGA handicap index of 2.4 or lower, as opposed to 0.4 or lower for the U.S. Amateur. The U.S. Mid-Amateur does not have a gender restriction, but there has never been a female champion.

The West Virginia Golf Association, in support and collaboration with the United States Golf Association, conducted the US Mid-Amateur qualifier on August 18th at Berry Hills Country Club in Charleston, WV. This is one of 69 qualifying sites across the country.

Over 60 golfers competed for three spots to advance to the U.S. Mid-Amateur Championship, as well as two alternate positions. Three golfers, including two West Virginians, qualified at Berry Hills Country Club.

Top honors went to Cam Roam of Huntington, who finished at (-4) 66. Finishing one stroke behind at (-3) 67 was Noah Mullens of Milton. The remaining qualifying spot went to Ralph Blasey of Arlington, VA, finishing at (-2) 68.

The two alternate spots went to Chase Roswall of Bristol, TN. and Dan Walters, Winston Salem, NC. Other top West Virginia finishers were Mitch Hoffman of Hurricane and Davey Jude of Kermit, tied for 8th at (E) 70, and Philip Reale of Ona, tied for 13th at (+2) 72.

This event brought golfers from 12 other states, Florida, Georgia, Kentucky, Maryland, New Jersey, New York, North Carolina, Ohio, Pennsylvania, South Carolina, Tennessee and Virginia, Canada and Mexico.

U.S. Qualifiers Continued...

11th U.S. Amateur Four-Ball Qualifier

The U.S. Amateur Four-Ball is an amateur golf tournament conducted by the United States Golf Association. It was first played in 2015 and replaced the U.S. Amateur Public Links, an individual tournament that was played from 1922 to 2014.

The U.S. Amateur Four-Ball is played by "sides" of two golfers, each with handicap indexes of 5.4 or less. 128 sides compete in a 36-hole stroke play qualifier that determines the field of 32 sides for match play. Play is conducted using a four-ball format, where the lowest score by either player on each hole is the score for the side.

The West Virginia Golf Association, in support and collaboration with the United States Golf Association, conducted 1 of 53 U.S. Four-Ball Amateur Qualifiers on September 17th at Edgewood Country Club in Sissonville, WV.

A field of 74 golfers, 37 teams, from around the country teed off hoping to earn one of two qualifying spots or one of two alternate spots in the U.S. Amateur Four-Ball qualifier.

Claiming the two qualifying positions were the team of Lucas Armstrong of Church Hill, TN and Jason Milllard of Murfreesboro, TN, finishing first at (-9) 62, followed by the team of Paul Fitzgerald and Scott Hamel, both of Charlotte, NC, scoring (-8) 63. Fitzgerald and Hamel won a playoff to qualify.

Zachary Watterson of Beatyville, KY, and Anders Larson of Pine Island, MN., also finished at (-8) 63 to earn one of two alternate positions. The other alternates are Jackson Hill of Beckley, WV and Dustin Demersseman of Athens, GA, finishing at (-7) 64, who also secured their spot on a playoff.

Only 20 percent of participants were from West Virginia. Players came from all over the country, California, Florida, Georgia, Indiana, Kansas, Kentucky, Maryland, New Jersey, New York, North Carolina, Ohio, Pennsylvania, Tennessee, Texas and Virginia, plus Germany and India. Other West Virginians finishing in the top 10 were Jared Taylor of Bluefield and Jess Ferrell of Fairmont tied for fourth, and Mike Veres of Logan and Philip Reale of Ona in ninth.



Tri-State PGA Classic



The Tri-State PGA Classic is a golf tournament for both professionals and amateurs, jointly organized by the Tri-State PGA and the West Virginia Golf Association. It was the opening event of the 2025 WVGA season and takes place at different courses within the region. The competition features different divisions for men, women, and professionals, with prizes such as gift certificates for amateurs and cash purses for professionals.



The 2025 Tri-State PGA Classic was played at Guyan Golf and Country Club in Huntington, WV on April 7th – 8th. This year's field featured 51 amateur and professional golfers from West Virginia, Idaho, Ohio and Pennsylvania.

Defending amateur champion Ryan Bilby secured a two-stroke lead during round one. Bilby returned the final day and secured a four-stroke win over the second-place players finishing with a (-7) 135. Tied for second at (-2) 69 were professional David Scragg of Sissonville and Lee Van Horn of Huntington. Rounding out the top five and tied for fourth at (-1) 70 were Tanner Vest of Shady Spring and Jack Michael of Huntington.

Two-Man Scramble Championship

The Two-Man Scramble Championship is a favorite event among many West Virginia golfers. This year's event sold out at 106 golfers. It is a 36-hole stroke play scramble with 18 holes played each day. The Stonehaven Course at Glade Springs Village held the two day Championship April 12th – 13th.

The 2025 West Virginia Two-Man Scramble saw new champions crowned in all three divisions. In the Championship Division, the team of Mason Weese and Mitch Hoffman led the first day with a 13 under par (-13) 59 on the strength of 13 birdies.

Davey Jude and Jeff McGraw came in third on round one, continued to play strong through the final round leading them to win by one stroke with a (-19) 125 for their two-day total.



Two-Senior Scramble Championship



The 2025 West Virginia Two-Senior Scramble Championship teed off at Cacapon Resort State Park in Berkeley Springs, WV May 9th. This Championship is open to male senior amateur golfers at least 50 years old with an active GHIN account.

This year's field featured 20 teams divided into two flights.

In the Championship Flight, the team of Chuck Workman of Marlinton and Jeff Harper of Coolville, Ohio, finished their first round with a six-stroke lead. They kept up their momentum during round 2 and finished the Championship with an eight-stroke lead scoring (-17) 127.

The First Flight ended with a scorecard playoff among three teams tying for the lead after round one and two. The team of Jerry McKisic and Steve Hollen, both of Buckhannon, took the title with a final score of (-4) 140. The other two teams battling for the lead were:



Two-Woman Scramble Championship

In 2025 the West Virginia Golf Association introduced the Two-Women Scramble Championship at Cacapon Resort State Park May 9th – 10th. This event is open to female amateur golfers with an active GHIN account. Although this year's event saw a small field of 7 teams, the WVGA expects this number to grow as Women's Golf continues to expand in West Virginia.

In the Championship Flight, the team of Kimberly Eaton of Charles Town and Karen Kinnett of Shepherdstown opened a five-stroke lead, finishing the first day at (+1) 73. They extended their lead to 11 strokes by the end of the second day, finishing the tournament at (+4) 148.

The First Flight team of Claytina Shepherd of Beckley and Kathy Thompson of Summersville finished the first day of competition with a six-stroke lead, finishing at (+10) 82. They finished the tournament with a 12-stroke lead over the competition, finishing at (+15) 159.



Junior Match Play Championship



The West Virginia Junior Match Play Championship is held annually for junior golfers who are members of the WVGA and are 18 years of age and younger. Sixteen players (Boys) and eight players (Girls) advance from 18-hole stroke play qualifying into the Junior Match Play Championship. Match Play kicked off on the morning of Saturday May 11th and was a single elimination format with a boys and girls division. The 25th Junior Match Play Championship took place at Parkersburg Country Club on May 10th and 11th.

On the girls' side, Audrey Kerr of Bridgeport and Madilyn Buttrey of Williamstown had a bye round into the semi-finals, only to meet up in the final round for the Championship. Kerr overcame a 5-hole deficit to take the win over Buttrey in 19 holes.

Jack Michael of Huntington defeated defending champion McCartney Hinkle of Bluefield, VA, 5 and 4 to claim the boys' title. In the semi-finals, Hinkle defeated Will Gruse of Charleston 4 and 3, while Michael defeated Tyler Beard of Lewisburg 1 up.



Senior Open Championship

The championship is a 36-hole stroke play championship with each division playing a separate set of tees. Divisions will include Championship and Senior. Senior Flight is open to Amateurs and players will play from tees based on their age.

The championship took place at the Raven Golf Club at Snowshoe June 13th- 14th. It is open to both amateur and professional golfers 50 years of age or older.

Pat Carter of Huntington won his sixth consecutive West Virginia Senior Open, finishing at two under par (-2) 142 for the two days, leading the closest competition by 10 strokes.



"I'd like to thank the WVGA for another great tournament and Chet Guzek for having the course in such great shape," Carter said. "It was a blast."

51st Senior Women's Amateur



Karen Kinnett of Shepherdstown, WV earned the title of the 51st WV Women's Senior Amateur Champion!

The Women's Senior Amateur Championship is for female amateur golfers aged 50 and over. This year's event hosted 50 players at Lewisburg Elks Country Club on June 16th – 17th.

Karen Kinnett of Shepherdstown, WV battled the field over the two-day tournament to finish with a (+22) 162 total. Reigning Champion, Melanie Collins placed 5th overall after tying with Karen Rainey in the first Round at 11 over par (+11) 81.

WV Four-Ball Championship


2023 Four-Ball Champions Bryson Beaver of Elkview and Tanner Vest of Shady Spring came from two strokes back at the end of day one to win the 2025 WV Four-Ball Championship on the Cobb Course at The Resort at Glade Springs in Daniels, finishing at (-17) 127.

The two-day tournament featured 104 golfers on 52 teams playing in four divisions.

Tied for second in the Championships Division at (-15) 129 were Joseph Kalaskey of South Charleston and Ryan Bilby of Follansbee, as well as Lee van Horn of Huntington and Noah Mullens of Milton. Rounding out the top five teams were Davey Jude of Kermit and Cam Roam of Huntington, tied with Jackson Woodburn of Scott Depot and Jack Michael of Huntington at (-14) 130.

The Second Flight Division, with 16 teams, ended Jeremy Thompson of Martinsburg and Owen Elliott of Falling Waters breaking the first day's three-way tie to win at (-7)137. Rounding out the top five teams were Jess Ferrell of Fairmont and Jared Taylor of Bluefield finishing second at (-3) 141. In third, finishing at (-2) 142, were Josh Howell and Aaron Kemlock, both of Fayetteville. Drew Green of Beaver and Drew Kane of Bridgeport finished fourth at (-1) 143. Tied for fifth at (E) 144 were JC Gould of Indore and Adam Sholes of Charleston, along with Jason and Carl King, both of New Haven.

A three-way tie highlighted the Third Flight, featuring 14 teams, with Mike Veres of Logan and John Evans of Chapmanville winning the division on a scorecard playoff at (+6) 150.



WV Junior Amateur Championship

The WV Junior Amateur Championship is open to amateur junior golfers who are under the age of 19. It is broken down into several divisions; Boys - (12&U), (13-14), and (Championship); Girls - (10-14) and (Championship). The Championship divisions will be a 54-hole stroke play event, while the other divisions will be 36 holes. Each division, at the conclusion of the championship, is awarded the player with the lowest 36- or 54-hole score. The overall Junior Amateur Champions come from the Championship divisions for boys and girls.

The 2025 WV Junior Amateur Championship was held at Canaan Valley Resort in Davis, WV July 1st – 3rd. There were 93 junior golfers in the field battling to be the next Champion.

Tommy Evans of Charles Town won the Boys' Championship field, he led all three days of the event, finishing at (-16) 200. Jack Michael of Huntington finished in second, two strokes back at (-14) 202, followed by Cooper Ward of Beaver in third, finishing today with a (-7) 65, to finish the three days at (-7) 209.

In the Girls' Championship Division, Chastyn Viars of South Charleston maintained a four-stroke lead to win at (+24) 240. Tied for second, at (+28) 244, were Audrey Kerr of Bridgeport and Lexi Green of Charleston. McKenzie Armstrong of Belmont finished fourth at (+29) 245, followed by Alana Hamaty of Bluefield in fifth at (+42) 258.

Chris Daniels of Beckley defeated John Bumgarner of Scott Depot 2 and 1 to become the 2025 West Virginia Senior Amateur Champion. The Championship, conducted by the West Virginia Golf Association, was played at Edgewood Country Club in Sissonville, and sponsored by Dutch Miller of Charleston. In the Senior Division, Scott Bibbee of Vienna defeated Nevin Wilson of Hurricane 4 and 3 to win the 2025 Senior Division Championship.

On the opening day of play in the Championship Division, Jonathan Clark of Hurricane and John Bumgarner tied for the lead in Championship stroke play. Clark was aided by one birdie, Bumgarner was aided by three birdies and an eagle on their way to the lead in the field of 31 players at one under par (-1) 70. In Senior stroke play, Scott Bibbee led a field of 35 golfers, finishing at even par (E) 71, aided by three birdies.

Following 18 holes of stroke play, both divisions embarked on another 18 holes of match play. The first round of 18-hole stroke play was a qualifier to set the seeding for the remainder of the tournament on Tuesday and Wednesday.

Chris Daniels and John Bumgarner teed off just after 8:00 a.m. on the third day of play to determine the 2025 West Virginia Senior Amateur Champion. In the Senior Division, Scott Bibbee and Nevin Wilson of Hurricane played for their division championship.

In semi-final match play in the Championship Division, Daniels defeated Dave Higinbotham of Daniels, while Pat Carter of Huntington defeated Hurricane's Harold Payne. In the other semi-final bracket, Michael Koreski of Parkersburg defeated Bob Clark of Wheeling, and Bumgarner defeated Robert McPeak of Parkersburg. In the final round leading to the Championship, Daniels defeated Carter, while Bumgarner defeated Koreski.

In Senior Division semi-final match play, Bibbee defeated Cledus Judd of Huntington, while Jim Freeman of Barboursville defeated Lee Cooperrider of Hurricane. In the other bracket, Wilson defeated David Eller, while Joe Crislip defeated Neil Christiansen, both of Parkersburg. In the final round, Bibbee defeated Freeman, while Wilson defeated Crislip.

The West Virginia Women's Amateur Championship is an annual golf tournament held at different West Virginia courses each year. Entries are open to female amateur golfers.

The WV Women's Amateur Championship is a 54-hole stroke play championship. Upon conclusion of Round 2, players will be flighted on a maximum of three flights but will be determined depending on field size.

102nd WV Women's Amateur

This year, sixteen females competed at The Club at Cress Creek to become the West Virginia Women's Amateur Champion.

The first round of stroke play saw Emily Holzopf of Rayland, Ohio, top the leaderboard at (E) 71.

Rounding out the top five, with ties, at the end of the first day were:

The Clinics were created to encourage more women to learn the game of golf while building long lasting relationships on the course. The West Virginia Golf Association has created a positive inviting atmosphere for women of all ages and experience level where confidence is built, friends are made, and golf is enjoyed.

As plans for year three are being discussed one topic is hot on the agenda, reaching more women. The West Virginia Golf Association is determined to continue the growth of women's golf in West Virginia. A large component of this growth will be the expansion of the Ladies Golf Clinics.

A hard decision was made in 2025 to only allow 20-25 participants per clinic unlike the previous year being unlimited. This allowed the quality of the clinics to increase as instructors were able to spend more one-on-one time with each participant. Over 320 women were in attendance during the 2025 season sessions. Each clinic was a sellout, most selling out within 24 hours of open registration.




13th Class of the West Virginia Golf Hall of Fame

The West Virginia Golf Hall of Fame revealed its first-ever inductees in 2009, when the incomparable pair of William C. Campbell and Sam Snead were enshrined as the inaugural class. Since that time an impressive list of those who made a profound impact on the game of golf in the Mountain State have been honored. The West Virginia Golf Association (WVGA) is extremely excited to announce the 2025 West Virginia Golf Hall of Fame inductees: David Bradshaw, originally of Harper's Ferry and now a resident of California, Weirton native Mike Krak and Sam O'Dell of Hurricane. They were enshrined during a ceremony conducted in November and joined 20 who have been recipients of this prestigious honor.



David Bradshaw

was a member of the Shepherd University golf team from 2001-2004, and during that time he won the 2004 West Virginia Open as an Amateur. David has since won 11 more West Virginia Open titles, placing him 2nd, all time, behind Sam Snead. David has competed in several PGA Tour events in his career and has also won many other professional events throughout the country.



Mike Krak

was Captain of the West Virginia University (WVU) golf team from 1944-1948 and was the first and only golfer to be inducted into the WVU Sports Hall of Fame in 2014. He played in 15 major championships in his career before coming back to West Virginia to become the Head Golf Professional at Lakeview Resort, later helping build The Pete Dye Golf Club in Bridgeport. He moved to Florida after a long career in the Mountain State, where he passed away in 2017.



Sam O'Dell

won the West Virginia Junior Amateur Championship in 1996 prior to attending Marshall University where he competed on the golf team from 1996-2000. He was inducted into the Marshall University Hall of Fame in 2020. O'Dell won the West Virginia Amateur four times and the West Virginia Mid Amateur six times. He has competed in several USGA events through the years, making the match play round in multiple US Mid Amateurs.

THE WILLIAM C. CAMPBELL SCHOLARSHIP

The William C. Campbell Scholarship was established in 1999 by the West Virginia Golf Association. Formed in the honor of Mr. Campbell for his international accomplishments as an amateur golfer and volunteer. Mr. Campbell is one of the greatest golfers to ever play the game. His winning record includes the U.S. Amateur, U.S. Senior Amateur, three titles on the West Virginia Open, as well as 15 West Virginia Amateur titles. Campbell was also a runner-up in both the U.S. Senior Open and British Amateur. He has been a member of eight Walker Cup teams, where he was undefeated in eight singles matches (7-0-1).


As an ambassador and volunteer to the game, Mr. Campbell was the only person to serve as both President of the United States Golf Association and Captain of the Royal & Ancient Club at St. Andrews, the two primary governing bodies of golf in the world.

In 1990, Campbell was inducted into the World Golf Hall of Fame; and in 2009, was inducted into the inaugural class of the West Virginia Golf Hall of Fame. Mr. Campbell passed away August 30, 2013 but his legend will not be forgotten. William C. Campbell Scholarships are awarded each year to graduating students based on their merit and involvement in the game of golf.

Funds for the Campbell Scholarship are generated by generous donors and through the annual William C. Campbell Classic.

The William C. Campbell Classic takes place on the Old White course at The Greenbrier Resort. We invite all golfers, with the initiative to support the scholarship, to register. All proceeds from the event go towards the William C. Campbell Scholarship.

Each year the West Virginia Golf Association, awards this scholarship based on the student's merit and exemplifies exceptional quality in their involvement, not only in the game of golf, but their community. The scholarship, named after Mr. Campbell, continues to live on through his legacy of what it means to be a true lady and gentleman.
